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FDPIR Supply Chain Disruptions - Third Tribal Consultation Session

Dear Tribal Leaders:

The U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) invites your participation in a Tribal Consultation Follow-Up regarding the Food Distribution Program on Indian Reservations (FDPIR) supply chain disruptions. This will be a continuation of the consultation held on Wednesday October 9, 2024. The short, medium, and long-term response actions will form the basis for this consultation. USDA continues to work urgently to return to regular, on-time deliveries of quality USDA Foods from the contracted national multi-food warehouse to the Commodity Supplemental Food Program (CSFP) and the Food Distribution Program on Indian Reservations (FDPIR). USDA's crisis response will be ongoing until inventory levels at CSFP and FDPIR sites and the availability of a sufficient variety and quantity of food resources for program participants return to acceptable levels for all participants.

Since the October 9, 2024, Tribal consultation, USDA has provided an update on the emergency surge contract and quality control, and transitioned the case management team to regional FNS staff by request of Tribal leaders and ITO staff. USDA will continue to implement short-term actions and to publish updated information regularly at www.fns.usda.gov/usda-foods/supply-chain-disruptions. USDA will also continue to communicate information and to answer questions during regularly scheduled meetings. USDA's dedicated team of case managers will continue to provide one-on-one weekly outreach as well.

The consultation follow-up will take place in person in advance of the Intertribal Agriculture Council Annual Conference in Las Vegas, Nevada. Virtual participation options are available through Zoom Link
